Description

This class is for 6th-12th grade students of all skill levels who may be seeking to draw for the first time but are not quite sure how or students who are interested in pursuing art seriously and want to develop a strong foundation of drawing skills. The first semester will focus on traditional instruction in the concepts of sketching and contour and line drawing. The second semester will focus on the concepts and techniques of shading and stippling. The first semester is a good foundation for the spring, but students may take either semester as a stand alone course. The primary subjects of drawing will include still-life objects and draped cloth. Students will be expected to maintain a sketchbook throughout each semester in addition to other out-of-class assignments in order to develop their drawing skills. By the end of each semester, students will have gained a fundamental knowledge of necessary drawing skills and concepts that will serve as a vital base for further art studies in all mediums.
